Race Number

The Cardiff Met Cardiff 10K is a timed event, using a timing chip which is attached to the back of your race number. Please secure your race number to the front of your vest / t-shirt.

DO NOT cut/fold or in any way modify your race number. During the race, your race number is your identification. If you don't correctly display your race number at all times you'll be disqualified and removed form the course.


Your timing chip will activate as you cross the start line so please don't worry if others start ahead of you.

Important - You must never wear someone else's Race Number (BIB). You must complete the medical Information on the back of the BIB. If you have a medical condition we should be aware of please mark the front of your race number with a **RED X**.

The colour on the background of the 10K race numbers indicates the pen you must start in (based on your expected finish time). These will be sign-posted on the day.

There is no need to register on the morning of the race, as long as you have your race number you are ready to run. If you have misplaced your race number, please visit the 10K information tent on Saturday 31 August between 12pm - 4pm or Sunday 1 September from 8am, a replacement number will be arranged at a cost of £5 (CASH ONLY | LIMITED NUMBER AVAILABLE).

Baggage

Runners can leave a single bag at the baggage within the race village on City Hall lawns.


Please do not bring, store or leave valuable items in your bag. The organisers, staff, volunteers or anyone working with or at the event will not be help responsible for loss or damage of personal items. All bags should be securely closed to make sure items don't fall out.

Please make sure you have everything you need for your run BEFORE dropping off your bag. Please loop the baggage band from your race pack around the handle of your bag for easy identification.

Race Village

Our race village is situated on Cardiff City Hall Lawns. It will offer a host of family friendly entertainment, retailers and street food. Post race Sports Massage & podiatry advice will be available from our title sponsors Cardiff Metropolitan University.



Pacing

We have a fantastic team of pacers who are there to help you. They'll be pacing people around to finish in 40, 45, 50, 55 and 60 Minutes.

The pacing team will be on the course wearing flags with your estimated finish time. Look out for the pacer within your start pen and try to stay with them throughout the race to hit your target time.

The Finish

Please keep moving through the finish area and into the funnel system as there will be a lot of runners finishing around you. Please listen to all instructions from the race team as it's vital that the flow of runners crossing the line is not stopped in any way.

AS YOU MAKE YOUR WAY THROUGHOUT THE FUNNEL, COLLECT YOUR FINISHERS TSHIRT AND MEDAL. YOU WON'T BE ABLE TO GO BACK TO GET THEM ONCE YOU LEAVE THE FINISH AREA.

Travel & Parking

Cardiff Civic Centre is easily accessible by car, foot or public transport, a short walk from the city-centre. There is ample city centre parking including Sophia Gardens, and the NCP car parks on Greyfriars road, Westgate Street and Knox road.

Road Closures

The Cardiff Met Cardiff 10K is a fully closed road event. There will be road closures in place. Details of all roads affected, and the timings of closures can be found here.

Lost Children

The lost children's point is at the 10K information tent in the race village.

Medical Advice

We strongly recommend that you have trained for the run and the challenge of completing the 10K course. Do not run if you feel unwell or have been recently unwell. Marshals will be located on the course to monitor, direct and assist runners. If you need any assistance they are your first point of contact. Medical points are located in City Hall Car Park, at the start / finish and at the 5K drinks station.

IF AT ANY POINT DURING THE RACE YOU FEEL UNABLE TO CONTINUE PLEASE STOP, REST AND LOOK FOR THE NEAREST MARSHAL FOR ADVICE. IT'S YOUR RESPONSIBILITY TO INFORM THE ORGANISERS IF YOU HAVE ANY SPECIAL MEDICAL CONDITIONS.

General Running Courtesy

Please be aware of your fellow runners during the event. Not everyone participating is an experienced runner and some will be running their very first 10K. We ask that you treat everyone with respect and offer to help anyone who may appear to need it during the race.

Photographs will be available to purchase from <u>Marathon Photos</u> within 24–48 hours after the race.


